




















Help with numbers • Less is more—only relevant information • Reduce need for calculations • Pictographs, diagrams • Frequency, not percent • Familiar objects as analogies – (3 oz. meat = deck of cards)





Teach Back Practice Jane went to her yearly check-up—free with her health insurance. She got a bill 2 months later. She called her insurance to ask why she was charged. During the check-up, the provider looked at a rash on her feet and diagnosed it as athlete's foot.
