



Naloxone

A medicine that can stop an opioid overdose. It can save your life.

- » helps a person breathe if they overdose on opioids
- » can be a nasal spray
 (Narcan®)
- » can be an injection
- » does not work if a person overdoses on alcohol or a non-opioid drug
- » can cause withdrawal symptoms like nausea, vomiting, or a fast heart rate

Naloxone nasal spray 4mg (Narcan®):

- » does not need to be assembled
- » starts working in 2-3 minutes
- » stops working in 30-90 minutes
- » is available without a prescription (find Narcan® at a pharmacy close to you: www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/opioids /safer-use.htm)
- » might be covered by insurance (ask your pharmacy for the price without insurance)

Always call 911 immediately if someone overdoses.
