

COVID-19 Vaccine Mini Lesson

Lesson #2: The Johnson & Johnson Pause

Materials:

Instructions:

1. Open the [COVID-19 Vaccine Mini-Lesson #2 PPT](#) in *presentation mode*.
 - a. Slide 1-2: Title slide and agenda. Explain that today we'll talk about a recent problem with one of the vaccines. Ask for vols to read the bullet points.
 - b. Slide 3: Ask if Ss can name the three types of COVID-19 Vaccines. Click through to check the answers.
 - c. Slide 4: Explain that today we will focus on the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, which has been in the news lately. Ask Ss to read the characteristics of the J&J vaccine.
 - d. Slide 5: Ask a S to read the first sentence. See if anyone has heard about the problem with the J&J vaccine.
 - e. Slide 6: Explain that the problem is blood clots.
 - i. Ask Ss, "What do you think is happening in this picture? What is a blood clot?"
 - ii. Be sure to point out how there are blood cells on one side of the clot, and none on the other—there is a blockage.
 - f. Slide 7-9: Ask Ss to read the slides about the response.
 - g. Slide 10: Tell Ss that many people have already gotten the J&J vaccine. (If you have, now would be a good time to share that if you are comfortable with that). Ask, "So what can you do if you have already gotten the J&J vaccine?"
 - i. Ask Ss to read through the sentences.
 - ii. Check for understanding on the symptoms—you may wish to ask some brave volunteers to explain or mime the symptoms!
 - iii. Be sure to emphasize that if you have any of these symptoms in the three weeks after vaccination, it is important to contact your doctor.
 - h. Slides 11-12: Short quiz. Which vaccines can you get right now?
 - i. Slide 13: Vols read the slide. Encourage Ss to talk to their provider if they have questions about their specific health conditions and the vaccine.
 - j. Slides 14-16: Review general vaccine information from lesson #1.
 - i. Vols to read through the sentences.
 - ii. Feel free to quiz Ss about the steps to see if they remember from lesson #1!
 - k. Slide 17: Share these resources with Ss in case they have more questions later.
