Types of COVID-19 Vaccines

- What are the three types of COVID-19 Vaccines?
 - Moderna
 - Pfizer
 - Janssen (Johnson & Johnson)



The Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

- For adults 18+
- 1 dose
- Immunity in 28 days
- Reduces risk of severe COVID-19 by 72%
- Reduces risk of hospitalization and death by 100%
- **6.8 million people got the Johnson & Johnson vaccine**

The Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

- The CDC temporarily stopped the Johnson & Johnson vaccine.
- Why?



The Problem:

Blood clots



How common is this problem?

- Extremely rare
- 6 people out of 6.8 million
- 1 person died



The Response

- The CDC stopped all Johnson & Johnson vaccines temporarily.
- On Saturday, April 24, CDC started using the vaccine again.
- Why?



The Response

- According to the CDC, "the benefits outweigh the risks."
- The chance of blood clots is very **low**.
- Protection against the virus is very **high**.



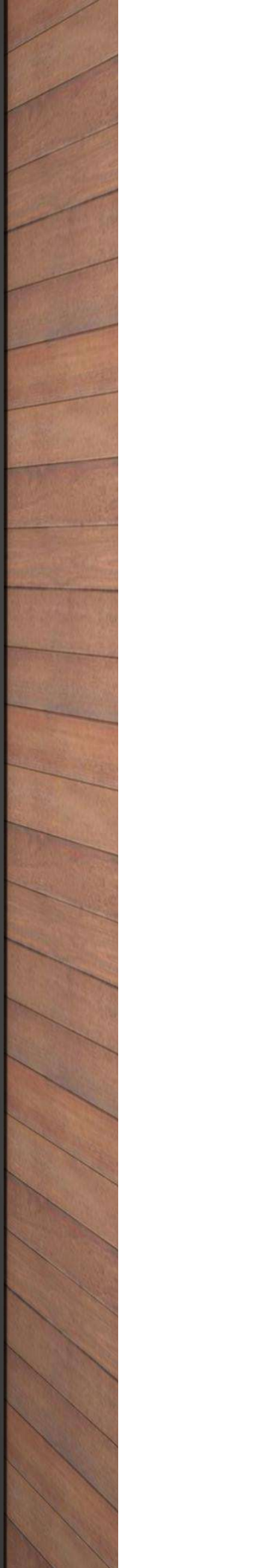
I got the J & J vaccine and I'm worried...

- Symptoms of a blood clot happen 6-13 days AFTER the vaccine
- If you got the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, you can:
 - Watch your symptoms for 3 weeks:
 - Severe headache
 - Stomach pain
 - Leg pain
 - Shortness of breath
 - If you have symptoms, call your doctor or clinic

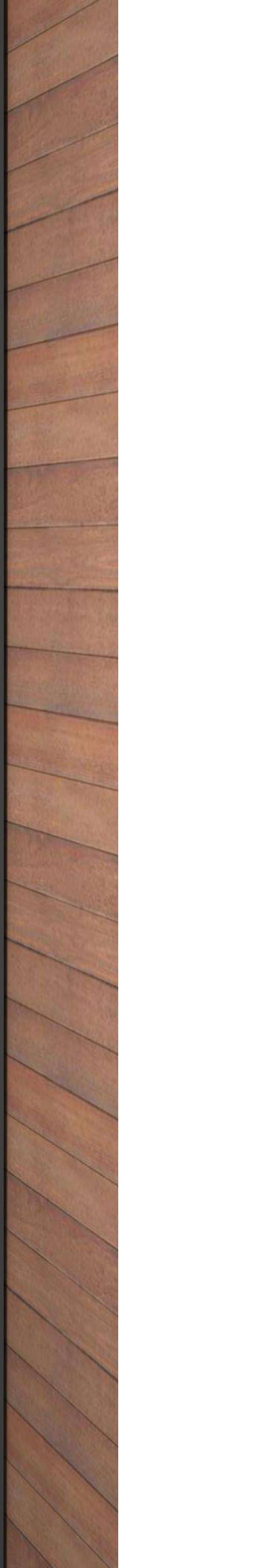
Who can get a vaccine?
