Find your vaccine records

If you lose your vaccine card, you can:

- Ask the place you got vaccinated for a new card.
- Find your record online at the 'Wisconsin Immunization Registry.'

What is the Wisconsin Immunization Registry (WIR)?

The WIR is a website where you can see all the vaccines you have gotten anywhere in Wisconsin, including pharmacies, your doctor's office, and vaccine clinics.

You might not see vaccines you got over 20 years ago, even if they were in Wisconsin.

Is the WIR private?

The WIR follows laws that protect personal health information. You must use your Social Security Number, Medicaid ID, or Health Care Member ID to access your online vaccine record. This helps protect your privacy.

How do I look up my vaccine record on the WIR?

2. Enter:

- o first name
- o last name
- birth date (MM/DD/YYYY)
- o **one** of the following:
 - Social Security Number
 - Medicaid ID
 - Health Care Member ID (ask your primary care doctor for this number)
- 3. Click 'search'
- 4. See the list of your vaccines
- 5. Click 'print'

You can show this to work, schools, daycares, and summer camps.

What if I can't find my record on the WIR?

Make sure you entered all the information correctly. If you still can't find your record, email dhs.wisconsin.gov. Remember, you may not see older records.
